REPORT ON HEALTHCARE COVERAGE 2007

On August 26, 2008, the US Census Bureau released an update on income, poverty, and health insurance coverage from the American Community Survey, 2008 Current Population Survey, and Annual Social and Economic Supplement for all states, congressional districts, metropolitan areas, counties, cities and American Indian/Alaska Native areas. Some results from the ACS are listed below:

Income

- The nation's poverty rate was not statistically different from 2006 to 2007.
- Median income rose in the Midwest, declined in the Northeast and remained statistically unchanged in the West.

Poverty

- The family poverty rate remained statistically unchanged from 2006 to 2007.
- For children younger than 18, the poverty rate climbed from 17.4% to 18.0 % in 2007.
- The poverty rate for the Northeast, Midwest and West all remained statistically unchanged from 2006 to 2007.
- The poverty rate in the South increased from 14.9 million in 2006 to 15.5 million in 2007.

Health Insurance Coverage

- The number of people covered by government health programs increased from 80.3 million in 2006 to 83.0 million in 2007.
- The Northeast and the Midwest had lower uninsured rates than the West and the South.
- Uninsured rates declined in every region except the Midwest where the change was not significant.
- The number of uninsured children declined from 11.7 % in 2006 to 11.0% in 2007, which is considered not statistically significant.



Using a three-year average, the US Census Bureau reports that Texas had the highest percentage of uninsured at 24.4%. The report also indicates that no one state had the "lowest" uninsured rate. Comparing a two-year average of uninsured rates, five states and the District of Columbia witnessed a reduction and 10 states saw an increase in the uninsured rate. MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: COVERING KIDS & FAMILIES IN IOWA ~ BACK TO SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

The Healthcare Coverage for Kids Coalition (HCKC) in collaboration with the Iowa Covering Kids & Families initiative (CKF) aim to increase enrollment and retention for eligible, uninsured children in public healthcare coverage programs such as Medicaid and Healthy and Well Kids in Iowa (hawk-i). This year these two groups, along with over 40 volunteers, partnered to hold a third annual Back-to-School Health Fair at McKinley Elementary on August 6, 2008. Children were provided with free school physicals, nutrition information, dental screenings, lead tests, immunizations, school supplies and hawk-i and Medicaid information. A total of 884 kids received school supplies (including one hawk-i application per bag), 370 received physicals, 44 received lead tests, 25 kids were immunized and 130 were provided with dental screenings.

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lowa events included not only those in Des Moines; many *hawk-i* outreach coordinators participated in the *Back-to-School* campaign in their local communities. From creating bulletin boards to distributing *hawk-i* applications at school registrations, children across the state were being prepared to go back to school healthy and ready to learn.

In addition to the health fair, *hawk-i* materials and information were provided to families and other interested partners each day at the lowa State Fair, which is one of the largest events in lowa, with millions of attendees each year. Partnering with the lowa Department of Public Health, CKF staff gave away over 500 brochures and other materials. all promoting the *hawk-i* program.
