Bernadette Sangalang is a program officer for the Children, Families, and Communities (CFC) program. She is responsible for grantmaking in both the early learning and children's health portfolios, and also oversees evaluation and learning across CFC. Bernadette received her Ph.D. in social work from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and received postdoctoral training in public health at the University of California at Berkeley. She also holds a Master of Social Welfare from University of Washington and a Bachelor of Arts from University of California at Berkeley.
