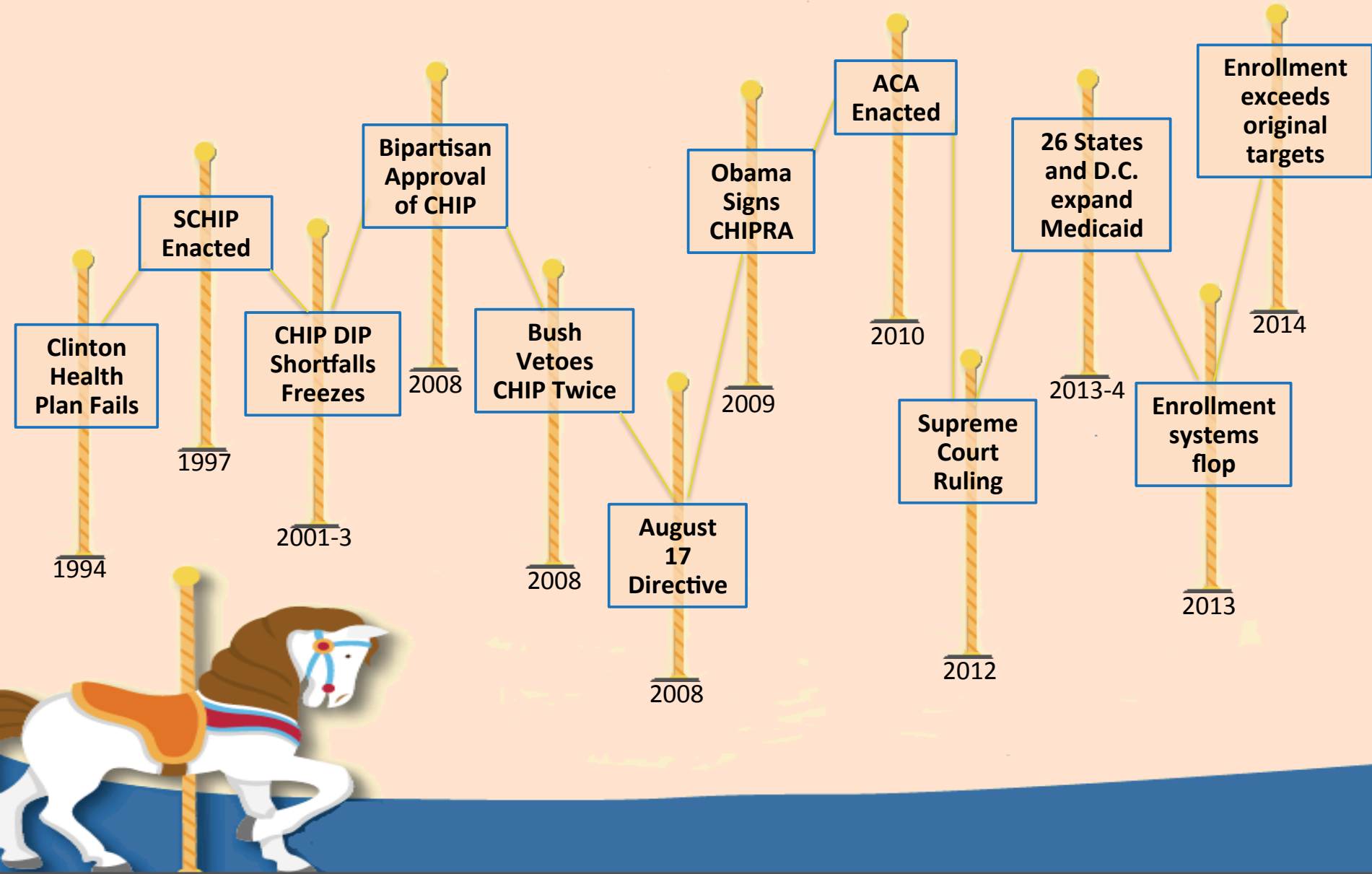

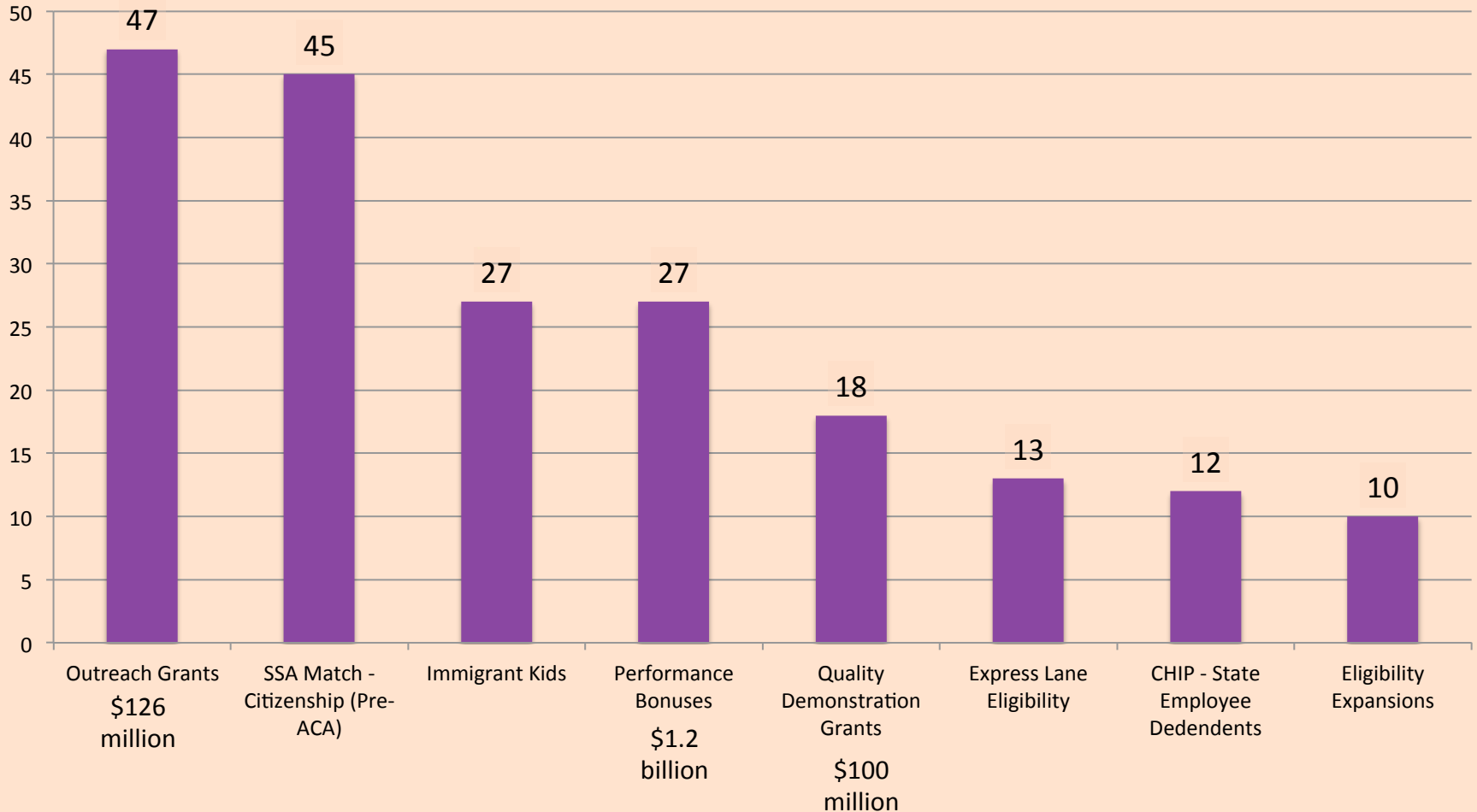
Ups & Downs of CHIP Reauthorization

- Can't take "backwards step" in covering kids
- "CHIP needs to continue until we know kids won't be worse off"
- Significant education needed to bring kids' issues to forefront but delicate balance:
 - Making case for what kids need without undermining QHP coverage
 - Dealing with the question of choice

Reflections of the Year

2012 ACS data show continuing decline in the rate of uninsured children (at national level and in 36 states).

CHIPRA Child Health Quality Measures – 47 states reporting a median of 14 (of 22) measures

First-ever CMS release of monthly state-by-state Medicaid and CHIP enrollment

Significant transformation of technology underway, replacing decades old eligibility systems

More than half of the states have expanded Medicaid, including 7 with R Governors

10% ↑ in public coverage:
5% ↓ in high school dropout
↑ in college attendance and attainment



Reflections of the Year

OH expanded children's PE; CO turned switch on 12-month continuous eligibility

OH and CO began covering lawfully residing immigrant kids

AR, CA, IL, NJ, OR, WV used fast-track strategies to enroll SNAP families in Medicaid and CHIP

More than 500,000 stairstep children now protected by Medicaid's entitlement

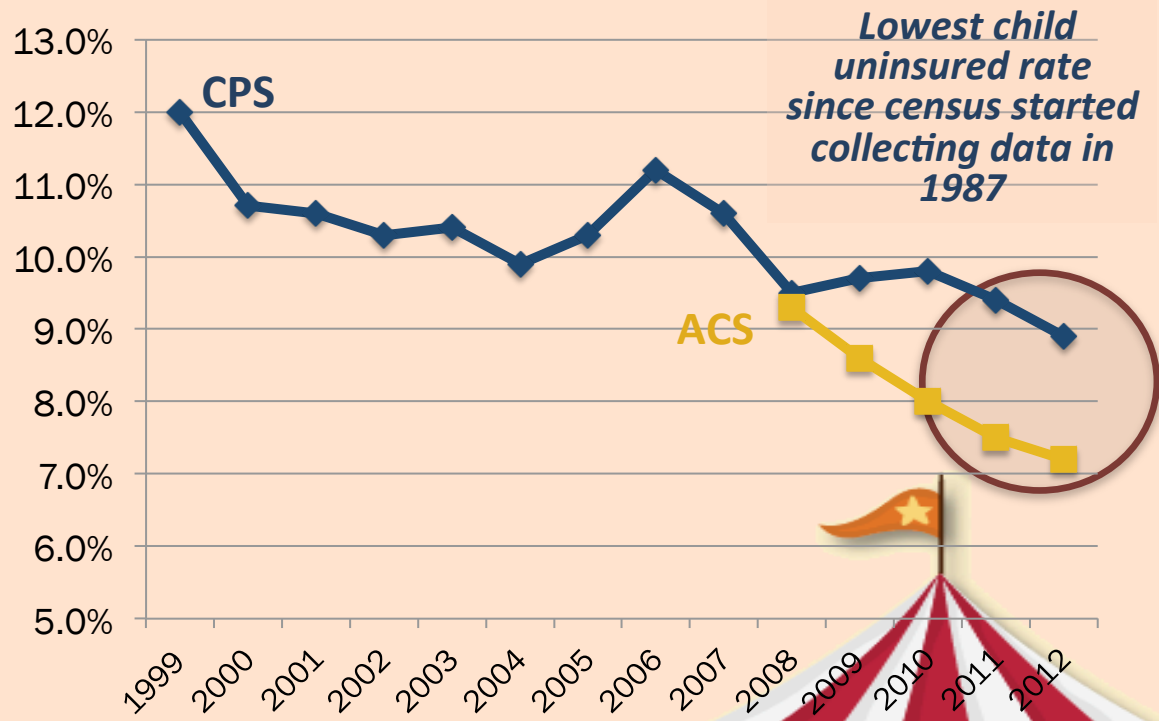
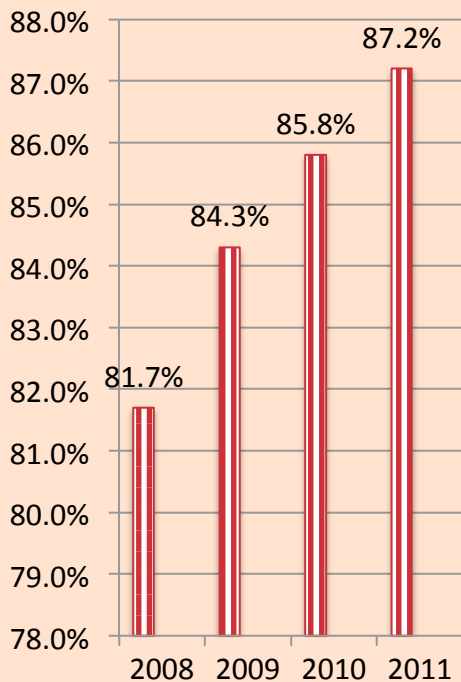
17 States eliminated CHIP waiting periods; 21 to go

12 states will cover former foster care youth who aged out in a different state
