



Members denied services




Unpaid claims

Improving EPSDT in Managed Care: Education and Clarification

 Develop training and informational materials about EPSDT benefits to educate plans, providers, members, and community stakeholders



 Work with the state (Iowa Medicaid Enterprise) to clarify the scope of EPSDT services provided by the MCOs and imposition of treatment limits

Improving EPSDT in Managed Care: Outreach and Identification

 Work with the Department of Human Services to update and increase the accuracy of contact information for Medicaid eligible children and families




Work with MCOs to integrate risk factors



associated with social determinants of health (housing, food, etc.) into a standardized Health Risk Assessment

Improving EPSDT in Managed Care: Outcomes and Benefits



 Gather, analyze, and disseminate outcome data (well-child visit rates, immunization rates, percent of eligible and enrolled children) to track changes prevs. post-managed care

•Work with AmeriGroup and United to cover EPSDT benefits for hawk-i members (AmeriHealth Caritas currently covers this benefit



Success: Creating a Seat at the Table



- Biweekly meetings that bring together:
 - Providers (Hospital Systems, Private Practices, Community Organizations)
 - High-Level Representatives from each MCO
 - State Medicaid Representatives
 - Advocates

Purpose:


- Monitor individual problems
- "connect the dots" to address these problems systemically
- revisit previously addressed issues to ensure that policy changes are implemented at the practice level

Challenges

- 1 + year into managed care, the transition is still extremely rocky
- Data discrepancies and data reliability
- Putting quality improvement work into the broader context of Medicaid defense... "putting out fires and moving mountains"
