The Census Bureau provides the following categories of coverage for respondents to indicate source of health insurance: current or former employer, purchased directly from an insurance company, Medicare, Medicaid or means-tested public coverage (includes CHIP), TRICARE/military health coverage, VA health care, Indian Health Service (IHS), or other. Individuals who indicate IHS as their only source of health coverage do not have
