

Medicaid is Vital to South Carolina's Children

Medicaid, or Healthy Connections, is a public health insurance program designed to help people who otherwise could not afford health coverage.

Medicaid is a lifeline to children and families in South Carolina and is built with children's unique needs in mind.

57% of people enrolled in Medicaid in South Carolina are children



Medicaid pays for 46% of South Carolina births

Helps ensure access to critical prenatal care, maternity care, and postpartum services.



Medicaid covers 43% of all South Carolina children

Insures children in low-income families and nearly all children in foster care.



Medicaid covers 60% of children in South Carolina with special health care needs

Provides medical, behavioral health, and long term care for children with special health care needs and disabilities.



Medicaid is the largest source of federal funding for mental health services

Supports mental and behavioral health treatment for children, adolescents, and adults.

HEALTHY CONNECTIONS IS VITAL TO SOUTH CAROLINA'S CHILDREN



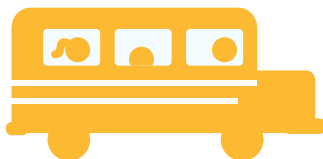
The federal government contributes \$2.28 to Medicaid for every \$1 South Carolina invests.



54% of federal funding sent to South Carolina is for Medicaid, which is about \$7.3 billion annually.
