# Medicaid is Vital to Virginia's Children

Medicaid is a public health insurance program designed to help people who otherwise could not afford health coverage.

Medicaid is a lifeline to children and families in Virginia and is built with children's unique needs in mind.

## 41% of people enrolled in Medicaid in Virginia are children



Medicaid pays for 35% of Virginia births

Helps ensure access to critical prenatal care, maternity care, and postpartum services.

Medicaid covers 31% of all Virginia children

Insures children in low-income families and nearly all children in foster care.



#### Medicaid covers 28% of children in Virginia with special health care needs

Provides medical, behavioral health, and long term care for children with special health care needs and disabilities.



#### Medicaid is the largest source of federal funding for mental health services

Supports mental and behavioral health treatment for children, adolescents, and adults.

## MEDICAID IS VITAL TO VIRGINIA'S CHILDREN



The federal government contributes \$1.02 to Medicaid for every \$1 Virginia invests.



60% of federal funding sent to Virginia is for Medicaid, which is about \$14.0 billion annually.
