
Medicaid is Vital to DC

DC Medicaid is a public health insurance program designed to help people who otherwise could not afford health coverage.

Medicaid is a statefederal partnership, which means it is jointly financed by federal and state funds.

MEDICAID IS VITAL TO DC'S BUDGET



The federal government **contributes \$2.33** to Medicaid **for every \$1** DC invests.

Federal funding for Medicaid is critical to health care in DC



Medicaid pays for 46% of births in DC

Helps ensure access to critical prenatal care, maternity care, and postpartum services.



Medicaid covers 41% of all DC children

Insures children in low-income families, children with special health care needs, and children in foster care.



Medicaid pays for the care of 83% of nursing home residents in DC

Provides critical nursing home and community-based services for seniors and people with disabilities.



Medicaid covers mental health services in DC

Nationally, Medicaid is the largest single source of funding for mental health and substance use care.

FEDERAL MEDICAID CUTS WOULD:

Do nothing to lower health care costs or improve quality and access to care.

Devastate state budgets, putting other priorities like K-12 funding at risk.

Undermine financial stability of the health system, especially rural hospitals and community clinics.



Jeopardize health coverage for millions of children and families, seniors, and people with disabilities.
